INFORMATION ITEMS

Northglen Neighbourhood School – Verbal Update

G. Payne, Executive Officer, Facilities Services provided an update on the Northglen Neighbourhood School. This unique rapid build project received approval to proceed by the ministry in November 2021. In May 2022, the board acquired Fielding International to create a vision for this new build including a consultation with all stakeholder groups. The visioning report was completed in February 2022. In March 2022, meetings began with Infrastructure Ontario (IO) along with the Ministry of Education (MOE). In August, the MOE through IO appointed Salter Pilon Architecture the architects for all projects under the rapid build portfolio. Around that same time the Project Charter and Memorandum of Understanding was finalized and signed by the Director of Education and Chairperson of the Board. October and November will see meetings involving the design team which will consist of members from the stakeholder groups. The design planning team will meet with MOE, IO and Salter Pilon to complete the design concept and set drawings. This process has a short turn around period in order for the build to begin in March 2023.

Student Accommodation Review: Elementary Family of Schools – Clarke High School

Superintendent Foster and Superintendent Gohil presented a consultation resource that includes a background study on the student accommodation pressures and scenarios for consideration to the committee. A Community Engagement Strategy has been developed for each review. The purpose of the engagement is to discuss possible cohort (i.e., grade), program and/or boundary options for the elementary schools within the Clarke High School Family of Schools to balance enrolment among them. The intent of the consultation is to share information and create awareness about the review; and to seek advice, informed opinion, or input for consideration prior to a decision being made. Information on the consultation process will endeavour to seek input from a variety of stakeholders including parents/caregivers, school councils, students, school staff, community members, trustees, school principal/vice-principals, and

superintendents. The consultation process will be communicated through letter distribution, website, social media and school newsletters, and school councils. The consultation process will include in person engagements at upcoming public consultation dates scheduled for December 6, 2022 and January 17, 2023. A report will be brought forward to Resource Committee that will include a summary of community feedback and the proposed solution for the area on February 1, 2023.

Trustee questions of clarification were addressed, specifically related to timelines for the community feedback summary. A request was made by the trustees for a Senior Administration representative to attend the school council meetings to answer questions.

Student Accommodation Review: Elementary Family of Schools – Port Hope High School

Superintendent Foster and Superintendent Gohil spoke to the Port Hope High School (HS) Family of Schools consultation resource that includes a background study on the student accommodation pressures and scenarios for information to the committee. Although the framework for the review and the concept in the report and appendices are similar to the Student Accommodation Review: Elementary Family of Schools – Clarke High School, they are being reported separately in order to represent two distinct Families of Schools in two different school communities.

The consultation process will be communicated through letter distribution, website, social media and school newsletters, and school councils and the process will include in person engagements at upcoming public consultation dates scheduled for December 5, 2022 and January 16, 2023. A report will be prepared for Resource Committee that will include a summary of community feedback and the proposed solution for each area on February 1, 2023.

Requests were made by trustees to reach out to local MP's in these areas to provide information on the consultation process and current options. Questions were brought forward regarding catchment areas and busing, French Immersion forecasting numbers showing a decrease, clarification of the moratorium and its guidelines and plans for new announcements around building in previously restricted areas. Concerns brought forward include the age of students being impacted by this review and the playground equipment and limited play areas at Intermediate/Secondary schools.

2021-2022 Year-end Financial Variance Report

Superintendent Foster took a moment to introduce Connor Pike, Manager of Finance, recognizing Connor for taking the lead in completing the year end financials and was thanked for all his hard work. Following this introduction, Superintendent Foster reviewed the report, which is based on September 1, 2021 to August 31, 2022 financial activity, as well as school enrolments as at October 31, 2021 and March 31, 2022. For fiscal year 2021-2022, the Board approved a budgeted deficit of \$0.407 million for external reporting purposes. The year-end consolidated operating and capital surplus of \$3.003 million compares to a budgeted deficit of \$0.407 million, for a favourable variance of \$3.41 million. The year-end consolidated compliance deficit of \$1.214 million compares to a budgeted compliance deficit of \$3.402 million, for a favourable variance of \$2.188 million.

2021-2022 Accumulated Surplus/Deficit and Deferred Revenue Report

Superintendent Foster summarized the description of various reserves, as well as the recommended allocation of funds to and from reserves for 2021-2022, in accordance with allowable use. The Public Sector Accounting Board (PSAB) standard requires that Internally Restricted Reserves are to be included in the Board's Accumulated Surplus. For Ministry and external reporting, the annual Surplus cannot be increased or decreased by moving amounts to or from reserve funds.

The PSAB and Ministry reporting requirements mandate boards to set aside certain unspent grant allocations until they are spent on their intended purpose. These externally restricted amounts are reported as Deferred Revenue.

The Draft Financial Statements for Year Ended August 31, 2022 will be presented to the Audit Committee on October 31, 2022.

**BACKGROUND**

1. Kawartha Pine Ridge District School Board (KPR) is focused on continuous improvement, service excellence and accountability.
2. At the October 25, 2022 Board meeting, a delegation made a presentation outlining the need to have Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs) in all KPR schools. The Board referred the presentation to senior administration for further investigation and requested a follow-up report to be presented at a subsequent meeting.

**STATUS**

3. Currently there are 45 locations in KPR that have at least one AED in the building (Appendix A).
4. The cost for an AED/Cabinet ranges from \$1,739 – \$2,127.
5. There are three main components of AEDs (Electrode Pads, Battery, Capacitor) and the cost to maintain each is listed in the chart below:

<b>Electrode Pads</b> (Life span 2-5 years)	
Standard Pads	\$ 55 per year
Pediatric Pads (age of < 8 years)	\$ 55 per year
<b>Batteries</b> (Life span 2-5 years)	\$ 45 per year

SSIC (Site Safety Inspection Committee)	nil
<b>Total Yearly Cost Per Unit</b>	
Standard Pads and Battery (90 sites)	\$100 per year
Pediatric Pads (65 sites)	\$ 55 per year

6. Total funding required to provide an AED in the remaining 46 locations would be roughly \$89,415 (average of \$1,987). Installation would be completed by Facilities Services at zero additional cost.

Maintaining AEDs in all 90 sites would have a yearly cost of roughly \$12,575.

**Automated External Defibrillators in  
Kawartha Pine Ridge District School Board Schools**

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**Training:**

AEDs are simple to use and currently there are no training requirements in place to use one. The cost for a limited number of school staff and administration to complete Standard First Aid/CPR/AED as per the requirements under the Occupational Health and Safety Act for First Aid Certification is covered by KPR.

An Automated External Defibrillator (AED) In Schools Procedure Document would be another consideration.

**BACKGROUND**

1.     Many school board transportation consortia across the province are experiencing school bus driver shortages. Driver shortages have resulted in route cancellations which impact students and families who are not provided with the required transportation services. It is acknowledged that any cancellation is a significant disruption and inconvenience for those affected.

**STATUS**

2.     In Kawartha Pine Ridge District School Board (KPR), all three regions of the board have been impacted, with Northumberland region having the highest incidence of shortages. There have been approximately 1,400 cancellations during the 2022-2023 school year thus far, impacting KPR schools.
3.     The top three schools by region most frequently impacted due to cancelled routes in the current school year are:

Clarington Region

- Courtice Intermediate School and Courtice Secondary School
- Newcastle Public School
- Clarington Central Intermediate School and Clarington Central Secondary School

Northumberland Region

- Cobourg Collegiate Institute
- Dr. M.S. Hawkins Senior Public School and Port Hope High School
- Brighton Public School

- Millbrook/South Cavan Public School

4. During the 2022-2023 school year, the daily driver shortage cancellations have peaked at approximately 41 routes. The average daily driver shortage cancellations are 25 routes. The route cancellations due to driver shortage include no drivers being assigned to the route, as well as absences and illness. Given the limited pool of drivers, one absence needing to be replaced causes an issue. With little to no backup drivers, a single absence can cause cancellations for an extended period.
5. Bus Operators have been working diligently to attract and retain drivers. Some initiatives that have been taken include increasing the hourly rate for drivers, providing incentives such as signing bonuses or referral bonuses, as well as bringing in out of town drivers to cover routes.
6. Driver shortages continue to be an issue for our board. As of November 30<sup>th</sup>, two routes were cancelled as a result of not having a permanent driver. These two routes impact four schools within our board. The remaining cancellations were a result of absences or illness.
7. Cancellations will continue to be an issue throughout the school year, until sufficient drivers can be hired to cover absences. On a system-wide basis, we are approximately 20 drivers short of being able to avoid daily bus cancellations due to absences or driver illnesses. Looking beyond cancellation avoidance, an additional 50 drivers would be needed to help deal with intermittent absences and route coverage demands which arise daily across the system.
