Trustee R. Kitney, Committee Chairperson, called the meeting to order (7:01 p.m.) and welcomed members and guests to the meeting. Trustee R. Kitney provided the land acknowledgement and stated that the Committee was meeting on the traditional territory of the Mississauga First Nations.

Alternative, International and Continuing Education

Superintendent Gohil reported that Kawartha Pine Ridge District School Board (KPR) Adult, Alternative and Continuing Education consists of secondary programing offered at three alternative sites: two Centres for Individual Studies (CIS) campuses (Clarington and Northumberland regions), and at Peterborough Alternative and Continuing Education at Peterborough Collegiate and Vocational School (PACE@PCVS). To effectively support student programming, the Alternative, International and Continuing Education (AICE) department was created in April 2022.

J. Knox, Principal of PACE@PCVS and Clarington and Northumberland CIS campuses reported that these day school programs serve students aged 16 and over, with the majority between the ages of 18-21 years. There are approximately 650 students registered in day school. The programs that are offered at the alternative sites and off site were described for the committee.

M. White, Program Coordinator for International students outlined the supports offered to students participating in international student exchanges.

KPR's Beginner Driver Education program was also explained to the committee.

November 25, 2022 Secondary Professional Activity Day

Associate Director McNaughton reported that the professional learning for the November 25, 2022 secondary Professional Activity (PA) day was created centrally by the Teaching and Learning K-12 department. The learning for secondary educators included Ministry of Education (MOE) mandated information, as well as school directed learning pathways. The KPR PA Days are planned with consideration of priorities in the KPR Strategic Plan and the Board Action Plan (BAP) 2022-2023. The professional learning included:

New Teacher Induction Program

Associate Director McNaughton reported that the New Teacher Induction Program (NTIP), that was established 2006, is a Ministry of Education supported program for Ontario teachers.

- J. McIlmoyle Parsons, Principal of Teaching and Learning K-12 (elementary focus) explained the three mandatory elements each school board is expected to provide:
- orientation for new teachers to the school and school board
- mentoring for new teachers by experienced teachers
- professional learning relevant to the individual needs of new teachers.

It was expressed that KPR's goals for all NTIP stakeholders include:

- building a sense of belonging and connection through mentoring and coaching
- developing a learning culture by offering responsive learning opportunities that reflect voice and choice interests and need
- supporting the process and awareness of NTIP Teacher Performance Appraisals and NTIP Strategy form
- attainment of the NTIP notation on their Ontario College of Teachers (OCT) profile.

SUBJECT TO COMMITTEE APPROVAL

KPR also welcomes all educators in long-term occasional positions to join the NTIP learning. This year KPR is serving over 280 elementary educators, over 160 secondary educators, as well as over 100 daily occasional educators.

In the past, NTIP educators attended one half day of orientation. In August 2022, KPR shifted to embed the NTIP Orientation into the Occasional Teacher New Employee Orientation (OT NEO) to minimize the stress on the occasional teacher supply list with half day absence. Professional learning opportunities are offered both after school and during school to provide equitable access for all educators in an ongoing way. In an effort to be proactive, strategic offerings of professional learning is based around key periods of time when new educators may benefit from specific support (e.g., reporting periods).

KPR established the NTIP teams coaching structure last year as part of a multi-pronged approach to build community and offer responsive learning. This "coach approach" structure was described in detail to the committee.

Educators who continue to wish to pursue professional learning after they attain the NTIP notation on their OCT profile are welcome to continue to take part in any NTIP learning for their first five years.

TOPIC: School Year Calendar 2023-2024

INITIATOR: John Ford, Superintendent of Education, Student Achievement

BACKGROUND

1. R.R.O. 1990, Regulation 304: School Year Calendar, Professional Activity Days (Regulation 304) requires boards to submit a school year calendar annually which will identify:

- school holidays (statutory and board designated)
- instructional days (187 elementary, 177 secondary) including:
 - examination days (maximum 10 days secondary)
 - professional activity days (maximum 7 days), three of those days must be devoted to provincial education priorities and four extra days can be designated by the board. The remaining days must be instructional days.
- Regulation 304 directs that instructional, examination and professional activity
 days will usually be provided between September 1 and June 30 and it sets the
 timing for the school holidays of the Winter and March breaks. Labour Day,
 Thanksgiving, Family Day, Easter, Victoria Day, and Canada Day are also set
 school holidays in the regulation.
- 3. Boards are required to submit the school year calendar to the Ministry of Education (MOE) for approval by May 1 of each year. If the Board decides to alter the established school holidays or extend the school year prior to September 1 or after June 30, it must submit the draft calendar to the MOE by March 1.
- 4. Professional activity and examination days can be altered after the calendar has been submitted and approved without further approval from the MOE.
- 5. Kawartha Pine Ridge District School Board (KPR) has traditionally planned its school year calendar in consultation with the Peterborough Victoria Northumberland and Clarington Catholic District School Board (PVNC) to jointly support our school communities and facilitate shared transportation costs.
- 6. Meetings with PVNC were held with subsequent conversations on calendar development and alignment.

STATUS

7 The initial draft of Elementary School Year Calendar (Appendix A – Option A) and the Secondary School Year Calendar (Appendix B – Option A) have been shared and reviewed with PVNC.

- 8. School Holidays and Elementary/Secondary Professional Activities are indicated on the calendars based on the current legislation and provides for seven Professional Activity Days in a school year. Appendix D outlines the proposed summary of Professional Activity Days for 2023-2024.
- 9. Instructional days for secondary students are balanced between the first and second semester (Appendix C).
- 10. The winter break mirrors the MOE recommended break. The board holiday before the March break remains.
- 11. This year's proposed calendar is a modified calendar because there is one Professional Activity Day scheduled for August 31, 2023, prior to the start of school.
- 12. The proposed 2023-2024 School Year Calendar has been reviewed with PVNC.
- 13. The calendar was shared with the KPR school community for feedback. Nearly 1,300 individuals responded (868 parents, 10 students, and 502 staff). Most respondents approved of the proposed calendar. The most frequent negative comment (3%) was about the winter break starting on December 22, 2023.

RECOMMENDATION

1. That the 2023-2024 School Year Calendars for elementary and secondary schools and School Year Calendar 2023-2024 Summary, be approved for submission to the Ministry of Education.

TOPIC: Virtual School Review

INITIATOR: John Ford, Superintendent, Student Achievement

BACKGROUND

1. In March of 2020 a global pandemic was declared and the Ontario Ministry of Education closed schools for the remainder of the school year.

- 2. In August of 2020 the Ministry of Education released Policy/Program Memorandum 164: Requirements for Remote Learning that defined the expectations for remote learning in the Province of Ontario. School boards were directed to offer both elementary and secondary remote learning options for students.
- 3. In September of 2020 the Kawartha Pine Ridge District School Board (KPR) launched both an elementary and a secondary virtual school.

STATUS

- 4. KPR continues to offer both elementary and secondary students a virtual option for their education.
- 5. Initial and current enrollment numbers for the Virtual Elementary School (VES) and the Virtual High School (VHS) can be seen in Appendix A. Approximately 68% of students who expressed an interest in learning virtually actually did so in both VES and VHS. Attrition for VES was about 7% and for VHS 3%.
- 6. Most of the elementary schools have a few students attending VES with the numbers reflecting the size of the elementary school (see Appendix B). Attendance is a significant issue with VES students especially with students in Grade 6 and above. Seventy-four students have missed more than 20 days of classes. Seventy-two percent of VES students reached the provincial achievement standard compared to 76% of students in bricks and mortar schools (see Appendix D).
- 7. The number of students from each school attending VHS from each high school can be seen in Appendix C. Many of these students attending VHS had issues with attendance at their home school. These students continue to struggle with attendance at VHS. Seventy-eight students missed more than 10 days of classes and 34 students missed more than 30 days of classes. To date this semester VHS has 150 credits at risk and over 200 Student Success Team referrals. Sixty-six percent of students reached the provincial standard in credits obtained compared to 75% of students in bricks and mortar schools (see Appendix D).

8. The cost of running VHS and VES is approximately \$1.9M. See Appendix E for a cost breakdown.



TOPIC: Secondary De-streaming

INITIATOR: Drew McNaughton, Associate Director of Education

BACKGROUND

1. In July 2020, the Ontario Ministry of Education announced plans for de-streaming the Grade 9 program, beginning with mathematics in September 2021. The Ministry identified three goals to anchor the implementation of de-streamed programing:

- Cultural Shifts in Schools and Boards to identify and dismantle systemic discrimination and structural inequities
- **Increased Educator Capacity** for effective culturally responsive instruction, assessment, and evaluation in de-streamed, multi-level classrooms
- Increased Student Engagement, Achievement, and Well-Being.
- 2. To prepare, KPR implemented a variety of strategies to build capacity for educators and communicate with students and families including:
 - running Grade 9 de-streamed math and English pilots
 - establishing a math leadership team
 - ongoing professional learning for all secondary educators and administrators, including two summer symposiums
 - professional learning and communication for elementary educators and administration to support the transition from Grade 8 to 9
 - implementing de-streamed regional coaches in quadmesters 3 and 4 of the 2021-2022 school year.

STATUS

- 3. In the fall of 2022-2023, all Grade 9 compulsory courses were de-streamed. This includes Grade 9 math and science, both of which have new curriculum. Grade 9 geography, English and French (Core French, Extended French, French Immersion) are also de-streamed but utilize the current academic curriculum.
- 4. Six secondary schools are engaging in a de-streamed math pilot for Grade 10 (Adam Scott Collegiate Vocational Institute, Bowmanville High School, Cobourg Collegiate Institute, Courtice Secondary School, Kenner Collegiate Vocational Institute, and Norwood District High School). Each of these schools have received an extra section for math and have committed to engaging in professional learning to support ongoing student success and achievement for Grade 10 math.
- 5. All secondary schools received two sections for additional Student Success staffing dedicated to an embedded de-streaming coach. This position is supported centrally, and coaches have been engaging in professional learning

- since June 2022 and throughout semester one. The embedded de-streaming coach collaborates and builds capacity with staff in regard to pedagogy and evidence-based practice, as well as supporting students in the classroom and Student Success hub settings.
- 6. Intentional system principal and consultant support is being provided to schools across the system to build capacity and support secondary educators and administration.
- 7. To support secondary schools in assisting students and parents/guardians when choosing a Grade 10 pathway for compulsory courses, the Teaching and Learning K-12 department has created a Pathway Planning Resource. Included in this resource are important considerations for all stakeholders, parent/guardian information, classroom educator information and considerations for Student Success teams.
- 8. Ongoing professional learning to support de-streaming is prioritized across the system, including secondary PD days, after school cafes, book clubs, classroom and lead teacher support.

TOPIC: Chromebook Essentials Professional Learning

BACKGROUND

 In 2019 focus group discussions were held with Kawartha Pine Ridge District School Board (KPR) educators that helped to inform the direction of the Board's 2020-2023 Instructional Technology Plan. This plan identified key areas of focus around technology and the focus groups highlighted a growing need for increased and consistent access to technology for students.

- 2. The pandemic identified significant gaps in access to technology for students due to a variety of factors. Additionally, Ontario's Ministry of Education Policy/Program Memorandum 164: Requirements for Remote Learning outlined the requirements for remote learning which accelerated the need for professional development for educators around the use of instructional technologies.
- 3. Beginning in September 2021, all KPR students in Grades 9 and 10 were provided with a Chromebook to provide more equitable access to technology for students.

STATUS

- Currently, all Grades 9, 10 and 11 students have been provided Chromebooks. By September 2023, all secondary students in KPR schools will have a board issued Chromebook.
- 5. Continued learning for secondary educators to effectively utilize student Chromebooks to support instruction and assessment has been a focus for 2022-2023. Additionally, secondary schools are employing larger numbers of new educators, many of whom have limited experience with Chromebooks and require professional learning.
- 6. The professional development modules in the Chromebook Essentials course have been created in response to identified educator needs with input from a number of experienced secondary education consultants. The Chromebook Essentials course begins with a Chromebook basics module followed by modules that increase in complexity as individuals work through the course. Educators have access to the course at any time and are able to move through the modules at their own pace.

- 7. The goal of the modules is to create a common understanding of the capabilities of Chromebooks and to ensure that educators have the knowledge, skills and confidence to effectively utilize Chromebooks to support instruction and assessment in classrooms.
- 8. The Chromebook Essentials course is currently available to all secondary educators, principals and vice principals.

RECOMMENDATION

1. That the Chromebook Essentials Professional Learning Report, dated February 7, 2023, be received for information.
